


Thank you for your purchase. The utmost care has gone into the design and manufacture of your clock. Please read these instructions carefully and keep them for future reference.



## POWER SUPPLY

Begin by plugging in the power cord into a standard household outlet. The display will flash indicating the time is ready to be set.

### SETTING THE TIME

- Hold down the TIME button and then press HOUR button to set the correct hour. The PM indicator will light when the hour is advanced into the PM time. Hold down the TIME button and then press MINUTE button to set the correct
- minute
- \* Release theTIME button when the correct time is shown on display.

### SETTING THE ALARM

- The PM indicator will light when the hour is advanced into the PM time.
- Hold down the ALARM button and then press MINUTE button to set the correct minute.
- Release the ALARM button when the correct alarm time is shown on display.

## USING THE ALARM

- Slide the Alarm ON/OFF switch to ON position. The alarm indication will appear on lower right side of display.
- Slide the Alarm ON/OFF switch to OFF position to deactivate the alarm. The alarm indicator dot will appear on the lower right side of display.

**USING THE SNOOZE** \* Press the SNOOZE button when the alarm sounds will stop the alarm and the alarm will sound again in nine minutes. The snooze function can be repeated many times

USING THE DISPLAY DIMMER SWITCH \* Press the DIMMER HI/LO switch to HI position for brighter display. \* Press the DIMMER HI/LO switch to LO position for normal display.

### USING THE BATTERY BACK UP

ING THE BATTERY BACK OP Insert TWO "AA" batteries into the battery compartment at the backside of clock. The battery will keep the alarm and time settings until the power is restored. The LED display will not light-up but the alarm will sound at the preset alarm time. If there is no battery installed but the power is interrupted, the display will flash at 12:00 and the time and alarm need to be set again.

Battery Warning Clean the battery contacts and also those of the device prior to battery installation. Follow the polarity (+) and (-) to place battery. Do not mix Alkaline, Standard (Carbon - Zinc), or Rechargeable (Nickel - Cadmium) batteries. Incorrect battery placement will damage the clock movement and battery may leak. Exhausted battery is to be removed from the product. Remove batteries from equipment which is not to be used for an extended period of time. 

# Safety Instructions

- 1. Read Instructions-All the safety and operating instructions should be read before the appliance is operated.
- Retain Instructions The safety and operating instructions should be retained for future 2 reference.
